Ingredients:

2 pkgs mini phyllo shells
1 8oz pkg Brie cheese, cut up into small pieces
1/4 cup raspberry jam (seedless)
1 pkg walnut chips

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place mini phyllo shells on a baking sheet. Place wedges of brie in each shell. Bake 5 minutes or until cheese starts to melt. Remove from oven and place a dollop of raspberry jam and a sprinkling of walnut chips onto each brie bite.

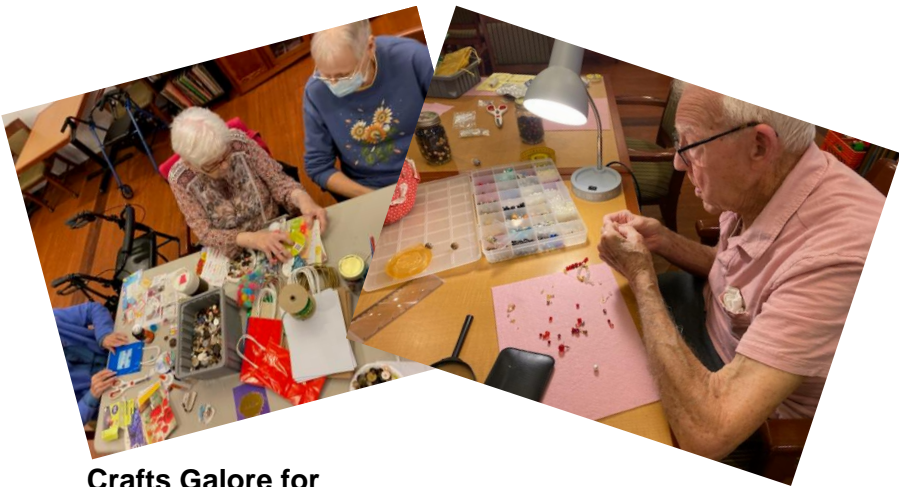
Executive Director's Corner

In its early days, Mother's Day was celebrated by attending church and sending Mom a handwritten letter. Today, Mother's Day is a \$28 billion industry. As well it should be! After all, if we were to pay Mom for the various tasks she performs, that salary would be astronomical. The least we can do is shower her with gifts! Mothers aren't the only ones who look forward to the holiday. It is the busiest day of the year for restaurants. Jewelry stores make out big, too. Shoppers spend \$5 billion on new bling for Mom. When Mother's Day began in 1914, the floral industry declared that carnations were the best way to honor mothers: red carnations for moms still living, and white for those who had passed. Today, the tradition of gifting flowers lives on. Mother's Day is the number one day for floral sales, which total \$2.66 billion.

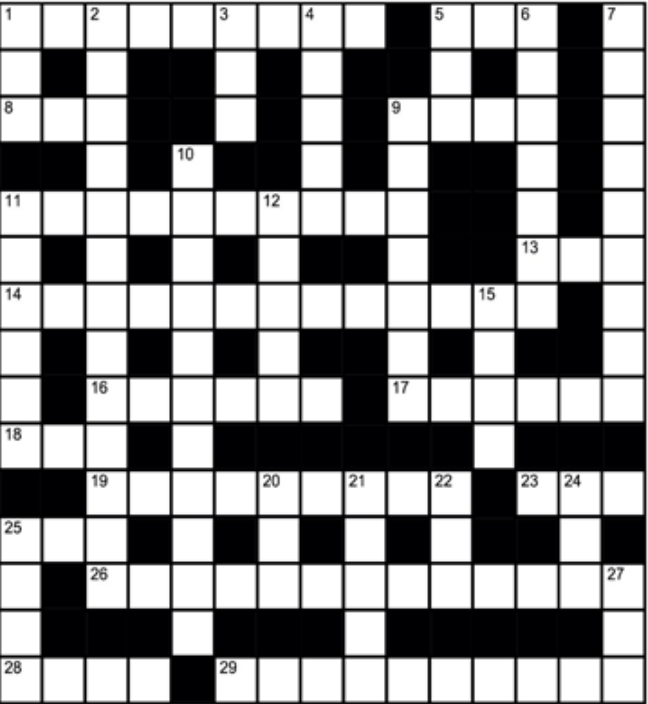
June 19th, **Happy Father's Day!**

The very first celebration of Father's Day was on June 19, 1910, at a YMCA in Spokane, WA. Sonora Smart Dodd had watched her father single-handedly raise six children. After hearing a sermon about the virtues of Mother's Day, Dodd approached her pastor and suggested a comparable holiday for fathers. Her pastor agreed and set the date for the third Sunday in June.

Then Dodd embarked upon a crusade to recognize Father's Day on a national level. She sought the help of trade groups that would benefit from such a holiday: tie and tobacco pipe manufacturers. It wasn't until 1972 that President Richard Nixon made Father's Day a permanent national holiday by signing it into law.
